The main focus of the Society is to be the information arm for the industry. The board has chosen issues that have an important impact on the future of the industry. ODA Pesticide Management Credit Sessions

This session will be important to you if you currently hold an ODA Pesticide license. Signing up for this course will give you 2 CME credits towards the maintenance of your license. This session will be given twice throughout the day and will be two hours each session (in order to have 2 CME credits). You must register for one of these classes in order to be on the class roster that is sent to ODA. In order to receive credit, you must attend the whole two-hour session and sign the roster at the end with the instructor. Continuing China Tariff Mitigation Efforts

While we hope the China Tariff issue is a short term problem for the handlers of hazelnuts, we are hoping it can become a long term positive. Our tariff into China has always been extraordinarily high at 25% for inshell. Other hazelnut producing countries have been less and some, like Chile are at zero.

We have taken this opportunity to continue to value and cultivate long term relationships with our trading partners in China, to involve members of the Chinese Consulate and to get our industry on the USDA radar. When the trade dispute is resolved, we hope to end up with a lower tariff than before.

In the meantime, the industry office has worked to engage in the three programs that have been offered to specialty crops affected by the tariffs.

- 1. Commodity Procurement Industry processors are working directly with the Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) on product specifications so that the USDA can purchase product which will ultimately benefit the Oregon Food Bank and the Farm to Schools program.
- 2. Market Facilitation All Industry growers may contact their local Farm Services Agency for details on how to apply for direct payments. The deadline to apply for funds is <u>July 15, 2019</u>. Use this link to find contact information for your local FSA office and to make an appointment:

- 3. Agricultural Trade Promotion Program In the first round of ATP funding the Hazelnut Industry was awarded \$115,000 to be used through the Western States Agricultural Trade Association (WUSATA) for the development of foreign markets. Industry staff have recently submitted a proposal through WUSATA for the second round of funding. The USDA Foreign Agricultural Services will be notifying applicants if their proposals were successful by the end of June 2019.

We look forward to expanding our markets with these dollars and are also aggressively pursuing other available funds to prepare for the larger crops that are on the horizon. The HMB Promotion Committee will be providing more detailed information at the meeting August 22nd.

Hazelnut Marketing Board - Marketing Order Operations



Do you plan to become a hazelnut handler this fall?

Each year the Marketing Board is required to offer the following information to the entire industry. Many of you, especially new growers, may be embarking on new and varied methods of selling hazelnuts and hazelnut products. Below are the details of becoming a handler along with the responsibilities.

The Hazelnut Marketing Order became law in 1949 and has been used by the industry to regulate aspects of quality and volume operations ever since. The order provides for establishment of a board that is elected by the industry. The order does not allow for the shipment of uninspected product or product that does not meet the kernel or in-shell standards into a commercial channel of trade. Sales made from roadside stands or sales made directly to the person who will be consuming the nuts are exempt from the Marketing Order. However, it is very important to note that the handlers have agreed to voluntarily subject all products to a pasteurization step before going to a user. This is paramount to the longevity of the industry and those with roadside stands or farmer markets should follow suit.

Handlers assessments are \$12 per ton of product handled. This is used to ensure quality standards, to prepare industry statistics as well as engage in research, education and promotion activities. Anyone who puts any number of hazelnuts into any commercial channel of trade, including mail order, is considered by the Marketing Order to be a handler and is subject to all the Hazelnut Marketing Board's controls and regulations.

Objective Yield Survey 2019

The Objective Yield Survey, administered by USDA-NASS, will begin July 26th and end on August 17th. Selected growers will be contacted by telephone to obtain permission to enter fields and confirm acreage and variety of selected orchard. Survey participation is encouraged in order to provide the Industry the most accurate crop data.


